

## Colonel Hubert Earl Bagley Jr.



Colonel Hubert Earl Bagley Jr. was commissioned a Second Lieutenant of Military Intelligence and awarded a Bachelors Degree upon graduation from Norfolk State University in 1983. He holds a Masters Degree in Strategic Studies from the US Army War College. His military education includes the Military Intelligence Officer Basic Course, the Military Intelligence Officer Advanced Course, the U.S. Army Command and General Staff College and the U.S.

Army War College. Prior positions include: Secretary of the Joint Staff (SJS), United States Forces-Iraq. Chief of Staff, United States Army Recruiting Command. Deputy Commander of the 2d Recruiting Brigade. He also served as Battalion Commander of the New Orleans Recruiting Battalion, New Orleans, LA.

Colonel Bagley has served in a variety of command and staff positions in the United States, Korea and Panama. His first assignment was with the 107th Military Intelligence Battalion, 7th Infantry Division, where he served as a Platoon Leader and Company Executive Officer. He also served as S2 for 2/32 Infantry Battalion, 7th Infantry Division. Following the MI Advanced Course, Colonel Bagley served as Signal Intelligence Team Chief; Chief Analyst; and Company Commander in the 513th Military Intelligence Brigade at Fort Monmouth, NJ.

While stationed in Panama, he served as Assistant Brigade S3, 470th Military Intelligence Brigade. In 1990, he was assigned to the U.S. Coast Guard Intelligence Center in Washington, DC, where he served as a counter-narcotics intelligence analyst. He later served as Watch Officer in the Army Operations Center and National

Military Joint Intelligence Center at the Pentagon, and Division Automation Officer, Camp Red Cloud, in the Republic of South Korea. He also held positions as Battalion Executive Officer and S3 for 15th and 163rd Military Intelligence Battalions, both located at Fort Hood, Texas, and as Deputy Mission Crew Commander (JSTARS) at Robins Air Force Base, GA. Following Battalion Command and prior to attending the War College, Colonel Bagley served as Special Assistant to the Chief of Staff, U.S. Army Recruiting Command at Fort Knox, KY.

His awards and decorations include the Legion of Merit Medal, Bronze Star Medal, Meritorious Service Medal with three Oak Leaf Clusters, the Joint Service Commendation Medal and the Army Commendation Medal.

Colonel Bagley and his wife, Tarita, have three children: Najee, Brandon, and Brianna.
