Mr. Greg Winn, Colonel USAF (Ret), is the Deputy Director of the Air Force Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps (AFJROTC) program under the Holm Center, Maxwell Air Force Base, Ala. As the Deputy Director, he assists the Director in overseeing a citizenship and character development program located in 884 high schools around the world. Headquarters AFJROTC supports over 1,960 retired officer and NCO instructors and over 110,500 high school cadets. His duties include the long range planning and programming of program funds and the execution of an annual budget in excess of \$80M. He received his commission through Air Force Reserve Officer Training Corps at Washington State University in June 1976. Career highlights include logging over 2,200 flying hours in the B-52G and B-1B, service on both the Air and Joint Staff, and as a Squadron Commander. He retired in 2004 as the Vice Commander of the Headquarters overseeing ROTC, OTS, and the AFJROTC program. He and his wife, Mari Lea, have four children, Geoff, Dawna, Catherine, and Greg II.
